Essential Skills

Welsh Government is committed to raising the levels of Essential Skills across Wales. Communication, Digital Literacy and Application of Number qualifications are an integral element to the funded apprenticeship frameworks.

These are usually delivered through workshops at one of our centres and will be planned well in advance. If you have completed Essential Skills previously or are able to provide suitable evidence, such as GCSE certificates or similar, you may be exempt from completing this element of the qualification.

Qualification Overview

To achieve the Level 2 Health and Social Care: Core learners will be assessed on five mandatory units. Assessment will be in the form of case studies and multiple choice questions.

Unit Title
Principles and values of health and social care (adults)
Health and well-being (adults)
Professional practice as a health and social care worker
Safeguarding individuals
Health and safety in health and social care

To achieve the Level 2 Health and Social Care: Practice (Adults) qualification, learners must achieve a minimum of 35 credits in total. Completing the Mandatory unit as well as:

- A minimum of 14 credits must be achieved from Optional group A
- The balance of 7 credits can be achieved from units in Optional groups A or B.
- Monthly tutor visits are required and extra visits or support can be provided if needed
- Tutor sessions may last up to two hours, core end point assessment tasks are supervised, and time must be allowed for them to be fully completed
- The qualification will take 15 months to complete
